G. Action Items

- 1. P3S Exam Update
 - All have been revalidated in past 3-4 years, all study guides are new and revised → print from CWEA bookstore
 - Must read KSAs to be "expert" in the KSA
 - Each KSA has a certain weight to it, focus on those more heavily weighted
 - Exams are undergoing another transformation in near future → will be reviewed by a consultant to make sure all questions are written grammatically correct. Will be completed in the next few years.
- 2. P3S Tool Belt Training Update
 - Bimonthly meetings (switching north to south)
 - August = maybe Lagunitas
 - October = back in south → tour of advanced water treatment plant possible
 - o If you would like to lead a tour or training please let us know
- 3. P3S Special Project Update
 - o Grant update → "1,000 Ways to Make a Change"
 - P3S budget has \$5,000 for grants
 - We give five \$1,000 grants to agencies to improve water in their community (outreach, stormwater improvements, etc.)
 - Grants are awarded by December 1st and the money must be spent by the end of the fiscal year
 - Applications are simple and should be out by July on the CWEA and P3S websites
- 4. P3S Facility of the Year Update
 - Stone Brewing won last year for large facility
 - o Last year we had a very low number of nominees
 - Nomination period is July 1st through mid-November
 - Nominate companies that are just doing something "better"
 - Pretreatment, stormwater, newer processes, business plan, community outreach, etc.
 - Entries are separated into large and small industries
 - Divided by revenue, volume of wastewater, and number of employees
 - More information is on the nomination form
 - o Goes beyond pretreatment program compliance
 - CWEA will do inspections in December/January of those that move up to the next step so awards can be printed.
 - o Non-winners get a certificate of merit
 - o More information is located on the website
- 5. PFI Update Subcommittee
 - o Pretreatment Facility Inspection book (aka Ken Kerry Manual) is being revised
 - currently with subcommittee and being reviewed
 - will become more like a college textbook and will have less illustrations

- Collections and Water Treatment books have already been completed

Board Meeting April 16 and Annual Business Meeting April 20, 2018 Sacramento

Annual Business Meeting Highlights: State of our Association is healthy

CWEA President Debi Lewis updated attendees at the April 20th Annual Business Meeting on the State of the Association. The Association received a clean audit for FY16-17 with one departure from Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), which we anticipated (for treatment of membership dues on a cash basis). CWEA's fiscal year ends June 30th; a report on preliminary year-end results will appear in the October *Clean Water*.

Through February 2018, financial performance for FY17-18 is on track. Year-to-date income is over budget by 5% and expenses are under budget -6%.

True to President Lewis's theme, the Association is **Stronger Together**. The Board continues to work on a new Strategic Plan to provide the best value for our members. Other accomplishments for the year include:

- CWEA and CA-NV American Water Works Association signed a Statement of Agreement to jointly develop the Advanced Water Treatment operator certification program
 - A new way of celebrating Water Professionals will take place during Water Professionals Appreciation Week every October
 - Clean Water Magazine featured a Women Impacting Water campaign to highlight California water leaders
 - CWEA will send its first Student Design Competition team to WEFTEC in New Orleans this October
 - Agencies, professionals and volunteers came together to assist in the fires and mudslides that rocked the state this year
- Launched <u>CAWaterInterns.org</u>, a free internship/apprenticeship listing site for public agencies.
 - Launched the Clear Path Project to make preparing for CWEA certification exams straightforward and clear
 - Launched Tri-Counties, Monterey Bay Section and North Coast section websites

April Board Meeting Highlights

At the April 16th Board meeting the Board reviewed and discussed key assumptions for the draft FY18-19 budget along with key priorities for the draft program of work. Highlights include:

- Clear Path Project continues: developing exam blueprints, improving exam forms and test items, and republishing updated exams for CSM grades 1-4, MT grades 1-4, and ECI grades 1-4.
- Monitoring attendance and performance of certification study sessions
- Approved FP116 revisions to the Kirt Brooks Memorial Water Environment Scholarship Fund developing a procedure for calculating the annual amount of scholarship grants

- Approved holding P3S 19 in February 2019 and will develop a plan to transition P3S 2020 to the fall of 2020
- Authorized the renewal of the Memorandum of Agreement between CWEA and the State Water Resources Control Board for training and outreach related to the Sanitary Sewer System WDR update
- Approved a SWRCB process for designating State and Regional Staff who can attend CWEA Educational Events at no charge
- Approved dates for AC20 in Reno: Tue Mar 31 Fri Apr 3, 2020
