 - All 4 levels are being worked on at same time. Can't release too much info at this time.
- 2. P3S Tool Belt Training Update
 - o Will have 2 more events this year
 - October in the south
 - Tour at OCSD (where wastewater goes to groundwater reuse facility

 combo tour)
 - No tentative date yet
 - December in the north
 - Russian River Brewing in Windsor
- 3. P3S Special Project Update
 - o Grant update → "1,000 Ways to Make a Change"
 - P3S budget has \$5,000 for grants

- Grant size \$500 to \$2,500 to agencies, depending on number of applicants, to improve water in their community (outreach, stormwater improvements, etc.)
- Grants are awarded by December 1st and the money must be spent by the end of the fiscal year
- If awarded you provide receipts and get reimbursed.

4. P3S Facility of the Year Update

- o Open now through November 11th
- o Last year we had a very low number of nominees
- Nomination package simplified this year. Can nominate through CWEA award site and also on P3S website.
- Nominate companies that are just doing something "better" beyond just "pretreatment"
 - Pretreatment, stormwater, newer processes, business plan, community outreach, etc.
- o Entries are separated into large and small industries
 - Divided by revenue, volume of wastewater, and number of employees
 - More information is on the nomination form
- Goes beyond pretreatment program compliance
- CWEA will do inspections in December/January of those that move up to the next step so awards can be printed.
- If facility wins they get recognized at the P3S annual conference
- o Non-winners get a certificate of merit
- o More information is located on the website

5. PFI Update Subcommittee

- o Pretreatment Facility Inspection book (aka Ken Kerry Manual) is being revised
 - currently with subcommittee and being reviewed
 - will become more like a college textbook and will have less illustrations
 - removing outdated information
 - Five teams, one person from north and one from south going through 2 chapters at a time. Hope to be done by end of year and hope to be released next year.
 - Collections and Water Treatment books have already been completed






